Every year in November, Veterans Day marks the day all Americans elect to remember those soldiers who made the ultimate sacrifice.

the Americans of Japanese Ancestry WWII Memorial Alliance (Memorial Alliance) who's mission it is to honor their fallen comrades. Architect, Isami "Mike" Tsuji explained that, "This wall is not just about the names -- it's about **not forgetting** the names."

The Memorial Alliance hosted a small ceremony at the JACCC Memorial Court followed by a lunch in Little Tokyo.
