### **58<sup>th</sup> California State Nisei VFW Reunion**

Welcome to the 58<sup>th</sup> Annual Nisei VFW Reunion held at the Sands Regency Hotel/Casino in Reno, Nevada. Over 100 veterans, spouses, friends and family gathered to honor the California Nisei Posts. In attendance was the VFW Commander-in-Chief, George Lisicki, along with VFW Department Commander Dave Norris and Ladies Auxillary President Marilyn Vernon. Each of the Nisei VFW Posts were represented which included: Post 1629 Monterey – Jim Suzuki, Post 1961 Gardena – Bobby Yoshioka, Post 3670 Kazuo Masuda – Jim Masaki, Post 4140 San Fernando Valley – Frank Tanaka, Post 5869 Hanford – John Randall, Post 8499 Fresno – Donald Wakida, Post 8985 Sacramento – Loren Ishii, Post 9879 San Francisco – Glenn Akagi, Post 9938 – Robert Hayamizu and Post 9970 San Jose – Henry Wadahara.

Friday began with a busy day of buses arriving from Sacramento and Los Angeles as well as visitors coming from all over the west coast including the Hawaiian islands.
